FOREIGN ENTRIES DOMINATE EARLY ENTRIES

Among the early entries to be received for this year's Africa Concours d'Elegance are 3 foreign entries.

The first to be received was the 1990 Lancia Delta Integrale of Navraaj Hans from Tanzania. The car will be making its second appearance at the Concours having debuted in 2023 and skipping last year.

This rally specification car was painstakingly restored after being salvaged from a scrap yard in Dar es Salaam. Introduced in the mid-1980s, the Delta Integrale was built for rally racing and became renowned for its exceptional handling, turbocharged performance and its unwavering stability. During its peak between 1987 and 1992, the Lancia Delta Integrale became synonymous with success, winning an astonishing 46 World Rally Championship (WRC) rallies and securing six consecutive Manufacturers' Championships – an unbreakable record that still resonates within the motorsport community today. The vibrant colors of the racing livery sparkle under the African sun, reflecting dreams, memories, and an enduring legacy.

Jonathan Somen has entered a gleaming red Alfa Romeo 2000GTV. Originally from South Africa, this beautiful coupe made in 1976 has been imported to Kenya for use in Kenya and to showcase the car in the Concours d'Elegance. The 105-series Bertone was one of the most iconic Alfa Romeos built, and the later model 2000 GTV carried what was probably the most famous Alfa Romeo engine ever built.

Another entry from overseas is the Austin 7 from England entered by Madatali Chatur. This historic car made in 1937 has an engine capacity of 748cc and with a saloon body and two rigid axles.

Among the early entries received locally is a strong contingent of Alfa Romeos entered by members of the Alfa Romeo Owners Club Kenya.

Victor Odero also makes a debut at the Concours with his entry of a 1988 BMW M3, the only one of its kind in Kenya. Restored with passion and precision, this is a fine example of BMW's rich motorsport legacy.

Last year's overall motorcycle winner David Odhuno leads the early motorcycle entries to be received by the Concours secretariat. David will once again be parading his 1989 Yamaha XTZ 750 Super Tenere along with a 2006 BMW GS 1200. He is flanked by Albert Karisa with a 2005 Honda CBF 1100. Long time motorcycle enthusiast Douglas Kiereini makes a strong statement with a record 6 bike entries including 3 Yamaha's, 2 Honda's and 1 Kawasaki.
